

## Connecting Cambridgeshire Members Update December 2025

## Our highlights of 2025

As 2025 wraps up, we want to share the progress we've made together over the last 12 months.

Thanks to your continued support, Cambridgeshire & Peterborough is one of the best-connected regions in the UK. There's certainly more to do, but the close of the year is a good time to celebrate the milestones and achievements.











- Gigabit broadband coverage: Over 92% of premises now have access hitting the 85% national target a full year early and ahead of the national average.
- Mobile improvements: Our barrier-busting work and independent mobile coverage testing data is being used to drive better 4G coverage for communities, road/rail lines, business & research parks and preparing the ground for 5G. Overall, there has been a 5% increase in good 4G mobile coverage accross our region in 20.
- Innovation leadership: Our CORE 5G Open Ran project is bringing cutting-edge technology to venues like Cambridge Corn Exchange. Our sensor deployments are collecting data on water levels, air quality and traffic patterns, while our delivery of the GCP autonomous vehicle trial is providing crucial insight to future transport innovation, putting Cambridgeshire at the forefront of smart technology.
- Digital inclusion: Digital Switchover campaign launched for residents and businesses. 12+ Digital Hubs created with 17 more scheduled to come on board in the new year - to help residents access devices, skills and support. Digital Inclusion Directory co-produced with Cambridge City Council and Cambridge Online, and we've supported district councils with shared prosperity funded digital inclusion projects locally.
- Award wins: National recognition for our work the CORE 5G OpenRAN project won two major industry awards (at the Small Cell Forum Mobile Network Awards and Connected Britain) and the Connecting Cambridgeshire programme earned two finalist spots at the prestigious LGC Awards. We also celebrated a second win at the Connected Britain Awards where our Digital Inclusion Lead, Will Plant, was named Rising Star - showcasing the talent and innovation driving our region forward.

environmental benefits by embedding fibre ducting into transport infrastructure projects. Avoiding costly retrofitting and supporting broadband expansion into underserved areas.


To date, over 46km of fibre ducting has been installed or designed into schemes for delivery by 2029, saving over 40 tonnes of CO₂ emissions\* - equivalent to 2,000 round-trip flights between London and Paris

Hosted by Cambridgeshire County Council and led by Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority, with additional investment from the Greater Cambridge Partnership, the Connecting Cambridgeshire Digital Connectivity Programme works with local councils, government, telecoms suppliers and network operators to improve digital connectivity for all.

#### There's still more to do

- Without our ongoing support and intervention, around 10,000 premises could still miss out on gigabit broadband without local action.
- · While we have excellent coverage in some areas of the county, there are some areas that still lack full coverage from all three mobile networks with some areas, 5.6% of the surveyed area - including parts of Northstowe, Ely city centre, Ramsey and Soham - struggling to get good 4G coverage from any operator.
- Continued growth in the region requires ongoing support to ensure that connectivity is provided in the right places for residents and businesses.
- Future facing connectivity is a cornerstone of the Combined Authority's strategic framework; a sub-strategy of the Local Transport and Connectivity Plan and underpinning the region's growth ambitions. Within the Local Growth Plan, digital infrastructure is not merely a supporting element but a fundamental catalyst for economic resilience and regional prosperity.
- Cambridgeshire is already seen as a leader in smart technology and connectivity trials, but to stay at the forefront, we need to build on our reputation for innovation. We need to continue fostering collaboration with industry and academia, creating opportunities for pilot projects and testbeds. This will ensure the region remains a top choice for companies looking to trial and invest in emerging technologies, driving economic growth and future-ready infrastructure.
- Our team regularly responds to enquiries from residents and councillors across the county and while many issues have been resolved, we're still keen to hear from you and any residents unable to access good mobile or broadband connectivity.
