Free CambWifi



Free CambWifi is continuing to expand its reach across Cambridgeshire market towns, helping to improve digital inclusion and support local economies. The secure public access Wifi network is now live in Ely, Huntingdon, March, Ramsey, St Ives, St Neots and Peterborough, with Whittlesey and Oxmoor due to be connected next. It's also widely available in public buildings, libraries and leisure centres across the county, plus Cambridge Park & Ride sites.

Digital Inclusion

Connecting Cambridgeshire's new Digital Inclusion lead officer, Will Plant, joins us this month from Westminster City Council where he gained wide experience as Digital Inclusion Manager. 


District Digital Overviews

Members Update

Broadband



Gigabit broadband coverage across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough has risen to over 79% (June 2023) with the prospect of future-proof connectivity for many more homes and businesses through public and private investment. This puts us ahead of projections to achieve our target of 85% gigabit capable coverage by 2025.

The Government's Project Gigabit contract to extend gigabit-capable full fibre coverage to >45,000 harder-toreach premises in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough has been awarded to City Fibre, with the £69million rollout due to start in September 2023 and the first connections due in early 2024.

Our proactive approach to barrier busting continues to be instrumental in facilitating commercial delivery: homeowners in Stilton are the first to be connected to Gigaclear's new £39m full fibre network, whilst CityFibre, County Broadband, Connect Fibre, Netomnia and Upp networks are expanding rapidly.

Gigabit Voucher Schemes

Connecting Cambridgeshire will work with communities where no Project Gigabit or commercial coverage is planned, to ensure residents don't miss out on the opportunity to apply for Rural Gigabit Vouchers to install full fibre connections (£4,500 per premise plus £1,500 top up if eligible) - when they become available again for Cambridgeshire residents in the autumn.

Funding



Connecting Cambridgeshire has secured £76k funding to trial Open RAN (Radio Area Network) technology in the region working in conjunction with AWTG as part of their Future RAN competition to show how it can be used to improve mobile connectivity.

A major funding bid has also been submitted to the Dept. for Science, Innovation and Technology (DSIT) Open Networks Ecosystem (ONE) Competition to improve mobile capacity in high density places.
